THE OPPORTUNITY

Southern Illinois University Carbondale (<u>SIU</u>) invites nominations and applications for the position of Dean of the College of Agricultural, Life, and Physical Sciences (CALPS). The Dean is the chief administrative and academic officer of the CALPS and reports to the Provost and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs. The successful candidate is expected to offer strategic leadership, a focus on innovation, and a vision for the future that will inspire the faculty, students, and staff to greater academic excellence.

CALPS offers innovative academic programming and engages in wide-ranging federally funded research. The College's teaching, research, and outreach missions are supported by University Farms and comprehensive research and laboratory facilities. Through the Schools of Agricultural Sciences, Biological Sciences, Chemical and Biomolecular Sciences, Earth Systems and Sustainability, Forestry and Horticulture, Physics and Applied Physics, and Illinois Soybean Center, CALPS offers a diverse academic curriculum for over 1400 students in undergraduate, master's and doctoral degree programs. Academic offerings support students with wide-ranging interests in agricultural sciences, life sciences, physical sciences and pre-health professional training. ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1869, SIU Carbondale is the flagship campus of the Southern Illinois University System, one of two public university systems in Illinois. SIU is a strong, diverse, student-centered, research-intensive, and comprehensive public university accredited by the Higher Learning Commission. Located 100 miles southeast of St. Louis, Missouri, SIU is a Carnegieclassified high research public university that ranks No. 8 among *College Gazette's* <u>"10 Best 'Hidden Gem'</u> <u>Public Universities in the U.S.</u>"

The University is committed to providing a welcoming environment and the highest possible quality of education that will prepare all its students to become productive citizens in a multicultural world. Recognized for its wide array of academic programs, its research agenda, and its strong presence in global education, the University is a partner in many international linkages and exchange agreements. The University is also known for its service to veterans and firstgeneration students, its commitment to students with disabilities, and its focus on inclusive excellence, entrepreneurialism, and sustainability. Just six hours south of Chicago and within easy driving distance of St. Louis, Memphis, Nashville, and Indianapolis, SIU draws students from the Midwest and also all 50 states and nearly 100 nations. The University offers about 100 undergraduate degrees, with more than 170 specializations and over 100 minors. Programming also includes about 69 master's degrees and more than 35 doctoral degrees, in addition to professional degrees in law and medicine.

Under the leadership of Chancellor Austin Lane, the University has embarked on the ambitious strategic plan, <u>Imagine 2030</u>. The plan focuses on five overarching themes, Student Success & Engagement, Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, Branding & Partnerships, Research & Innovation, and Sustainability. Each of these "strategic pillars" will be used as key focus areas to guide resource allocation with staffing, funding and execution.



CARBONDALE, ILLINOIS

Carbondale is where education, culture, and nature come together. Carbondale is a city in <u>Jackson County</u>, Illinois, within the <u>Southern Illinois</u> region informally known as "Little Egypt." It is a few miles away from the mid-Mississippi River. The city was developed in 1853 because of the stimulation of railroad construction in the area. Today the major roadways of <u>Illinois Route 13</u> and <u>U.S. Route 51</u> intersect in the city.

The physical beauty of the region is a major attraction to students, faculty, and visitors. Sixty miles to the south of Carbondale is the historic confluence of the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers, the two forming the border of the southern tip of the state. Situated 10 miles southeast of the campus are two state parks and four large recreational lakes. Much of the area is a part of the 240,000-acre Shawnee National Forest, which features strikingly beautiful oak-hickory forests, flourishing wetlands, lush canyons, razorback ridges and unique geological features. A rare convergence of six natural ecological regions results in a diversity of plant and animal species. The city is the most populous in Southern Illinois outside the St. Louis <u>Metro-East</u> region and the most populous city in the Carbondale-<u>Marion-Herrin</u>, Illinois Combined Statistical Area. As of the 2010 census, the city had a population of 25,902, and it is the state's 20th-mostpopulated city outside the <u>Chicago Metropolitan Area</u>. In addition, the CSA has 126,575 residents, the sixthmost-populous <u>combined statistical area</u> in Illinois.

SIU is fortunate to partner closely with the region's largest private employer, Southern Illinois Healthcare, on many initiatives including for support to expand academic programs and increase enrollment. Likewise, the University enjoys strong relationships with state and local elected officials in the region, the Carbondale Chamber of Commerce and civic, education, and business leaders throughout southern Illinois.
