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ABOUT UND

Established in 1883, the University of North Dakota is the oldest research university in North Dakota. Founded with a strong liberal arts foundation, it is the state's flagship university and is classified by the Carnegie Foundation as having high research activity. UND offers degrees in more than 225 fields of study and enrolls more than 14,000 students.

The College of Nursing and Professional Disciplines (CNPD) is home to the departments of nursing, nutrition & dietetics, and social work. The department of nursing offers the state's only Nurse Anesthesia program, the state's only Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner program, the state's only PhD in nursing program as well as the Recruitment & Retention of American Indians into Nursing (RAIN) program. Additionally, UND is home to the state's only School of Law and School of Medicine.

Additionally, the North Dakota Nursing Research Collaborative was initiated by UND's nursing department to bring together a diverse group of nurse researchers, expert clinicians, and nursing leaders to conduct interprofessional research aimed to demonstrate the value of North Dakota's nursing workforce while improving healthcare outcomes.

UND is located in Grand Forks, North Dakota, a vibrant college town of over 59,000 people located on the border of North Dakota and Minnesota. Short commutes, a great public-school system, high quality medical facilities, low crime, ample parks and theaters, and a cost of living below that found in large American cities are some of Grand Forks' advantages. Ranked as one of the top 5 Best Small College Towns and America's Best Hockey Town, Grand Forks offers stellar quality of life without the metropolitan hassles.

THE POSITION

DIRECTOR, PHD NURSING

The University of North Dakota is seeking candidates for the position of Director of the PhD Nursing Program within the College of Nursing & Professional Disciplines. The Director reports directly to the Chair of the Graduate Nursing Department and will be hired at a rank of Associate or Full Professor, based upon experience and qualifications. This is a tenured position in the Department of Nursing and the successful applicant must have already attained tenure at another institution in a similar field and will be subject to approval by the University and State Board of Higher Education.

The CNPD seeks a dynamic and visionary leader who will build upon the PhD Nursing Program strengths in planning, organization, and evaluation of the PhD Nursing Program to provide exceptional professional educational experiences. In addition, the Director will assist in recruiting PhD Nursing students and mentoring PhD Nursing faculty. The Director will have unquestioned integrity and exemplary interpersonal and communication skills.

The starting date for the PhD Nursing Program Director will be negotiable, but preferably by July 1, 2025. This is an oncampus position.

THE OPPORTUNITY WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF GRADUATE NURSING

The Director of the PhD Nursing program at UND will be joining the University during a dynamic period. Under the leadership of President Andrew Armacost (who joined UND in 2020) and Provost Eric Carl Link (who joined UND in 2021), the campus is experiencing enrollment growth and major campus improvements with several buildings under construction and/or renovation currently. Significant investments at the University in terms of research development in critical areas are propelling the University forward as the flagship research institution in the state of North Dakota. Meanwhile, the University's ongoing commitments to student success at both the undergraduate and graduate level continue to elevate the tradition of educational excellence at the institution.

Under the leadership of Dean Maridee Shogren (appointed in 2022) and Graduate Nursing Chair Kris Hendrickx (appointed in 2019), the incoming Director of the PhD Nursing Program will have the opportunity to build on the long-standing tradition of excellence within the Department and to work alongside both internal and external partners to increase and enhance the PhD Nursing Program.

THE POSITION (CONT.)

The following is an abbreviated list of the responsibilities associated with this position:

- Provide leadership for the overall planning, organization, revisions, and evaluation of the PhD Nursing Program.
- Recommend course offerings, scheduling, and related faculty assignments to the graduate department Chair.
- Recruit, advise, and oversee the annual admission process of qualified students.
- Foster a culture of inclusivity and support for students.
- Serve as teaching faculty, student and dissertation advisor, and dissertation committee lead/member.
- Oversee the students' course and program progression, qualification for candidacy, dissertation completion and graduation of PhD Nursing students.
- Plan and implement with doctoral faculty intensive student experiences.

- Assure the educational program contains content consistent with the guidelines and regulatory standards of the UND School of Graduate Studies, Office of Research Development and Compliance, and the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN).
- Prepare materials and reports as required by nursing approval bodies.
- · Supervise assigned staff.
- Maintain strong relationships with internal and external stakeholders, including nursing research communities within and beyond UND.
- · Collaborate with healthcare partners.
- Engage with North Dakota Nursing Research Collaborative.
